Trial Chamber IX of the International Criminal Court (the ‘ICC’ or the ‘Court’), in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Dominic Ongwen* (the ‘Ongwen case’), having regard to article 75(2) of the Rome Statute and Rule 144(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, issues this Order Scheduling a Hearing for the Delivery of the Reparations Order

THE CHAMBER HEREBY

ANNOUNCES that it will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, 28 February 2024 at 15:00hrs, in a Courtroom to be determined, to deliver its Reparations Order, in the presence, live or remotely, of Mr Dominic Ongwen, his defence team, the Legal Representatives of Victims,¹ and the Common Legal Representative of Victims;²

INSTRUCTS the Registry to assess the possibility of securing the attendance of the convicted person either physically at the seat of the Court or through the use of video technology and report back to the Chamber by Monday, 19 February 2024, at the latest; and

INVITES the Trust Fund for Victims and the Office of the Prosecutor to attend this hearing.

¹ Mr Joseph Akwenyu Manoba and Mr Francisco Cox, representing 2,594 victims authorised to participate in the proceedings.

² Ms Paolina Massidda, appointed as Counsel from the Office of the Public Counsel for Victims to represent 1,501 victims authorised to participate in the proceedings.
