I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Registry hereby transmits to Pre-Trial Chamber I ("Chamber"), a request received on 11 July 2024, from the Arab Organisation for Human Rights UK (AOHR UK), to submit observations in the present Situation as *amicus curiae*, in accordance with rule 103(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

II. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

2. On 27 June 2024, the Chamber issued its "*Public redacted version of 'Order deciding on the United Kingdom's request to provide observations pursuant to Rule 103(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, and setting deadlines for any other requests for leave to file amicus curiae observations'*" ("Order").¹
3. On 11 July 2024, the Registry received an e-mail from M. Jamil, with a document attached thereto, entitled "*Request by the Arab Organisation for Human Rights UK (AOHR UK) for Leave to Submit Written Observations Pursuant to Rule 103*" ("Request").²
4. In the context of a similar request, and upon the Registry's request for guidance, on 1 July 2024, the Chamber provided the Registry with directions as to how to process this type of documents.³
