I. Introduction

1. The Registry submits the present report ("Registry Report") and its two annexes consisting of a confidential version of items recognized as evidence formally submitted and its public redacted version, pursuant to the "Directions on the conduct of proceedings" ("Directions"), issued by Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") on 4 October 2021.¹

II. Procedural History

2. On 4 October 2021, the Chamber issued its Directions, in which it directed the Registry to: "[...] *reflect all formally submitted items in the eCourt metadata [...]*", and to "[...] *submit reports for each witness who testifies, indicating which items have been formally submitted by the parties and participants in relation to that witness. The email exchanges [...] are to be annexed to this filing, applying redactions as appropriate*".²
3. On 30 May 2024, the Defence called their eleventh witness, witness D-0036. After the conclusion of the examination of witness D-0036, the Defence formally submitted items used during the hearings of the said witness, as instructed in the Directions.
4. On 6 June 2024, the Chamber, via email, issued the decision on items of evidence recognised as formally submitted for witness D-0036.³ Pursuant to the Directions, the Registry was instructed to apply redactions as appropriate to the emails in Annex 1 to the present filing.

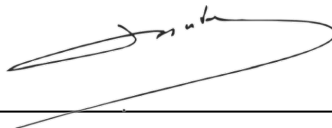
