I. Introduction

1. The Registry submits the present report ("Registry Report") and its two annexes consisting of a confidential version of items recognized as evidence formally submitted and its public redacted version, pursuant to the "Directions on the conduct of proceedings" ("Directions"), issued by Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") on 4 October 2021.¹

II. Procedural History

2. On 4 October 2021, the Chamber issued its Directions, in which it directed the Registry to: "[...] *reflect all formally submitted items in the eCourt metadata [...]*", and to "[...] *submit reports for each witness who testifies, indicating which items have been formally submitted by the parties and participants in relation to that witness. The email exchanges [...] are to be annexed to this filing, applying redactions as appropriate*".²
3. On 4 June 2024, the Defence called their twelfth witness, witness D-0001. After the conclusion of the examination of witness D-0001, the Defence and Prosecution formally submitted items used during the hearings of the said witness, as instructed in the Directions.
4. On 18 June 2024, the Chamber, via email, issued the decision on items of evidence recognised as formally submitted for witness D-0001.³ Pursuant to the Directions, the Registry was instructed to apply redactions as appropriate to the emails in Annex 1 to the present filing.

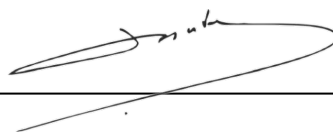
