I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Registry hereby transmits to Pre Trial Chamber I (“Chamber”), a submission received on 18 December 2024, from Amnesty International, titled *“Request for leave to Reply to the “Prosecution’s response to the ‘Victims’ request for clarification and an order to compel the Prosecutor to act on their legal obligations under article 15(3)”* (“Request”).

II. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

2. On 18 December 2024, the Registry received an e-mail from Amnesty International with a document attached thereto, titled *“Request for leave to Reply to the “Prosecution’s response to the ‘Victims’ request for clarification and an order to compel the Prosecutor to act on their legal obligations under article 15(3)”*.¹
3. On 19 December 2024, the Registry liaised with the Chamber to seek guidance on how to submit the Request in the case record.²
