I. Introduction

1. The Registry submits with the present report and its two annexes, the public redacted and confidential versions of email decisions pursuant to the “Directions on the conduct of proceedings”¹ (“Directions”), issued on 4 October 2021 by Trial Chamber I (“Chamber”).²

II. Procedural History

2. On 4 October 2021, the Chamber issued the Directions instructing the Registry to file all email decisions on the case record in quarterly reports starting 1 November 2021.³
3. The Chamber directed the parties and participants to: i) frame their requests made by email in a way that make their publicity possible; and ii) indicate in the email when emails cannot be made public at all.⁴

III. Classification

4. Pursuant to regulation 23bis(1) of the Regulations of the Court, some of the annexes are classified as “confidential” because they refer to sensitive information that should not be disclosed to the public.

IV. Applicable law

5. For the purpose of the present submission, the Registry considered articles 64(7), 64(10) and 67(1) of the Rome Statute and rule 137 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

V. Submissions

6. In the Directions, the Chamber provided criteria for the application of the redactions to the email decisions. The Registry was instructed *inter alia* to apply redactions to i) names of Chambers staff members, where applicable; ii) names of Registry staff members, if deemed necessary by the Registry; and iii) any personal email address or other private or personal information. The Registry shall consult the participants on the redactions applied.⁵
7. In order to enable the parties and participants to suggest specific additional redactions, Registry liaised with the Prosecution, the Defence, the Common Legal Representatives of Victims (“CLRVs”), and relevant sections of the Registry.⁶ The Prosecution proposed additional redactions to Annex 1.⁷ No further redactions were proposed by the Defence or CLRVs.⁸
8. Accordingly, the Registry applied redactions to emails set forth in the following two annexes:
 - **Annex 1:** RE: Outcome Vulnerability Assessment DAR-D31-P-0035, dated 20 April 2024 19:59; and,

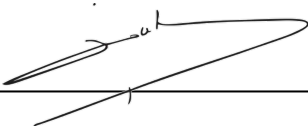
