I. Transmission

1. The Victims Participation and Reparations Section (“VPRS”) presently submits for judicial approval its eligibility and priority determinations for reparations of 94 victims found eligible for reparations and priority treatment within the Trust Fund for Victims’ (“TFV”) Interim Draft Implementation Plan (“IDIP”).
2. This submission is made pursuant to the First Decision on the Trust Fund for Victims’ Draft Implementation Plan for Reparations, in which Trial Chamber II (“Chamber”) assigned the VPRS the mandate to identify potential beneficiaries, collect relevant information, and conduct the administrative eligibility process for reparations.¹
3. The dossiers transmitted with the present submission are from victims of the attacks, who were identified as eligible for reparations under the IDIP by the VPRS between July and December 2024.²
4. In its eligibility table transmitted in Annex, the VPRS combines its assessments on the victims’ eligibility, priority status and urgent needs for the purpose of the IDIP.³

The VPRS has maintained the same format and applied the same criteria⁴ as in previous transmissions of VPRS determinations for IDIP victims' dossiers.⁵ The VPRS will simultaneously transmit the dossiers of these 94 victims to the Chamber and the TFV, outside the case record.

II. Classification

5. Pursuant to regulation 23*bis*(1) of the Regulations of the Court, the Annex to this document is classified confidential *ex parte*, only available to the TFV and the relevant Common Legal Representative of victims ("CLR"),⁶ since it contains sensitive information on the victims concerned.
