PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER I of the International Criminal Court issues this decision on the request for extension of time limit by the Kingdom of the Netherlands (the ‘Request’).¹

1. On 12 June 2025, the Defence filed the ‘Urgent Request for Interim Release’.²
2. On 18 June 2025, pursuant to rule 119(3) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulation 51 of the Regulations of the Court, the Chamber invited observations from the [REDACTED] and the Kingdom of the Netherlands on the Interim Release Request, setting 2 July 2025 as time limit.³
3. On 3 July 2025, the Registry transmitted to the Chamber the Request from the Kingdom of the Netherlands, dated 2 July 2025, seeking an extension of the time limit to submit its observations until 11 July 2025.
4. Noting that, pursuant to regulation 51 of the Regulations, ‘[f]or the purposes of a decision on interim release, the Pre-Trial Chamber shall seek observations from the host State’, and that the extension sought is reasonable, the Chamber finds that there is good cause to extend the relevant time limit under regulation 35(2) of the Regulations of the Court.

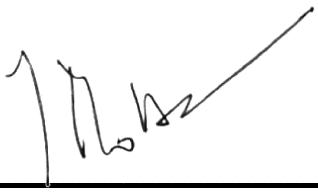
