I. NOTIFICATION

1. The Prosecution submits this communication regarding the disclosure of evidence to the Defence, in compliance with rules 76(3) and 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, and pursuant to its ongoing disclosure obligations.¹ The items are recently obtained victim application forms for dual status witnesses.

II. CONFIDENTIALITY

2. The Annex, appended to this filing, is classified as “Confidential” as it refers to evidence disclosed *inter partes* that should not be released to the public.

III. DISCLOSURE OF EVIDENCE

3. On 8 October 2025, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence 12 items.

4. The items are organised under the following disclosure package:

Pre-Confirmation Rule 77 package 019 08 October 2025, containing
12 items, listed in Confidential Annex A.

5. The disclosure package consists of victim application forms concerning dual status witnesses. The Prosecution received these forms from the Office of Public Counsel for Victims (“OPCV”) on 8 September 2025. After the necessary time for dual status verification and general disclosure review, the Prosecution is now in a position to disclose these with appropriate standard redactions, as agreed upon with the OPCV.
