I. Introduction

1. In accordance with rule 13(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("RPE"), the Registry hereby transmits to Pre-Trial Chamber I of the International Criminal Court ("ICC" or "Court"), Libya's formal declaration of acceptance of the exercise of jurisdiction by the Court under article 12(3) of the Rome Statute, as received from the State of Libya ("State of Libya" or "Libya") on 12 May 2025.

II. Procedural History

2. On 26 February 2011 the United Nations Security Council adopted Resolution 1970 referring the situation in Libya since 15 February 2011 to the Court.¹
3. On 12 May 2025, the State of Libya submitted a formal Declaration pursuant to article 12 (3) of the Rome Statute to the Office of the Registrar.²
4. On 14 May 2025, the Office of the Registrar received a supplementary document endorsing the formal Declaration.³

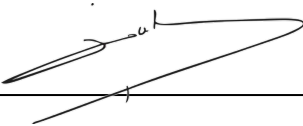
