I. Transmission

1. The Victims Participation and Reparations Section (“VPRS”) submits for the Trial Chamber II (“Chamber”)’s judicial approval its determinations on victims’ eligibility for reparations, and, where applicable, their priority status, with respect to 700 newly identified victims’ dossiers collected by the VPRS.
2. This submission is made pursuant to the Chamber’s “First Decision on the Trust Fund for Victims’ Draft Implementation Plan for Reparations”,¹ and the Chamber’s decision issued on 2 April 2026 (“Decision”),² in which the VPRS was instructed to transfer to the Chamber lists of applicants under the ‘modified A-B-C’ approach.
3. The dossiers transmitted with the present submission, which are both from victims of the attacks and victims of crimes against child soldiers, are classified as group A: victims eligible for reparations.³ To determine their eligibility for reparations, the VPRS has assessed each victim’s dossier in line with the criteria applied in previous reports.⁴
4. Annex I contains the list of 98 applicants found eligible for priority treatment under the Trust Fund for Victims’ Initial Implementation Plan (“IIP”). For the assessment

of these dossiers, the VPRS has applied the criteria as in previous transmissions to determine their priority status and urgent needs.⁵

5. Annex II contains the list of 602 applicants found eligible for reparations (“non-IIP”). In Part A, the VPRS lists the 498 victims of the attacks, and in Part B, the 104 victims of crimes against child soldiers.
6. The VPRS will simultaneously transmit the dossiers of these 700 victims to the Chamber and the TFV, outside the case record.

II. Classification

7. Annex I and II to this document are classified confidential, pursuant to paragraph 19 of the Decision and paragraph 96 of the Chambers Practice Manual.⁶
