I. Procedural history

1. On 29 January 2026, Rights for peace (RfP), REDRESS, Darfur Women Action Group Uganda (DWAG Uganda), Darfur Network for Human Rights (DNHR), and Queen's University Belfast Human Rights Centre (HRC), (collectively "the Applicants") filed a Request for leave to submit *amicus curiae* observations on reparation pursuant to article 75 of the Statute and Rule 103 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence in the situation in Darfur, Sudan in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Ali Muhammad Ali Abd-Al-Rahman*.¹
2. On 11 February 2026, the Chamber granted the Applicants leave to make *amicus curiae* submissions by 4 May 2026.² Following the Applicants' request to this effect,³ the Chamber granted the Applicants an extension of time limit of one month to submit its observations.⁴

II. Submission

3. On 2 April 2026, this Chamber issued a decision in which it *inter alia* scheduled a hearing on reparations matters for 8 September 2026.⁵ In its decision, the Chamber directed any of the participating *amici curiae* that wish to attend the hearing to file a request to do so no later than 4 May 2026.⁶
4. Thus, pursuant to the Chamber's 2 April Decision and Rule 103 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, the Applicants hereby requests leave to attend the reparations hearing in this case.
