1. Between 16 March 2026 and 6 July 2026, upon the Chamber's request,¹ the parties and participants submitted their observations on reparations.² On 3 July 2026, the parties filed their responses.³
2. On 2 April 2026, the Chamber, *inter alia*, scheduled a hearing on reparations on 8 September 2016.⁴ On 22 May 2026, the Chamber granted the *amici curiae*'s request to attend the hearing on reparations.⁵
3. The public hearing will be held on 8 September 2026, beginning at 09:30 and consisting of three sessions of 90 minutes each.⁶ In the hearing, the Chamber will hear final submissions from the parties, participants and *amici curiae*⁷ and may ask questions as necessary. To facilitate their preparation, the Chamber will provide the parties and participants with its initial questions ahead of the hearing to facilitate their preparation.

4. Subject to adjustments, as appropriate, the speaking order for the hearing on reparations shall be as follows:
 - The Common Legal Representatives of Victims' (the 'CLRV') submissions (40 minutes);
 - The Prosecution's submissions (10 minutes); and
 - The TFV's submissions (30 minutes).
 - The Registry's submissions (15 minutes);
 - The *amicus curiae* GCC's submissions (10 minutes);
 - The *amici curiae* GLAN *et al.*'s submissions (10 minutes);
 - The *amici curiae* REDRESS *et al.*'s submissions (10 minutes);
 - The *amicus curiae* i-ACT's submissions (10 minutes); and
 - Authorities of the Government of Sudan's submissions, if any (10 minutes);⁸
 - Defence submissions (40 minutes);
 - Questions from the Chamber.
5. The Chamber reaffirms the importance of the public, and more specifically the victims, being able to follow the hearing on reparations. Therefore, the submissions will, in principle, be presented in public session. The Chamber will only authorise private sessions for discrete instances where the parties and participants must refer to confidential information.
6. Pursuant to rule 96(1) of the Rules, the Chamber instructs the Registry to take all necessary measures, including outreach activities, in order to publicise the hearing on reparations.

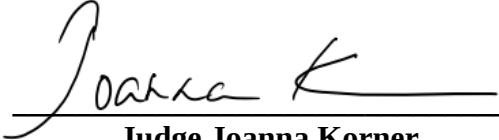
FOR THESE REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

SCHEDULES the hearing on reparations to be held on 8 September 2026 between 09:30 and 16:00 in accordance with the schedule in paragraphs 3-4;

INVITES the CLRV, the Defence, the Prosecution, the Registry, the TFV, the authorities of the Government of Sudan and the *amici curiae* to make final submissions on reparations during the hearing; and

INSTRUCTS the Registry to take all necessary measures to publicise the hearing on reparations.
