1. In accordance with the Oral Decision of Trial Chamber I ordering the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (VPRS) to transmit *“a selection of applications for participation which fall within the category which might be considered indirect victims”*,¹ the following 19 applications are hereby transmitted: VPRS/1, a/0016/06, a/0076/06, a/0080/06, a/0106/06, a/0107/06, a/0109/06, a/0137/06, a/0138/06, a/0154/06, a/0188/06, a/0234/06, a/0006/07, a/0042/07, a/0163/07, a/0250/07, a/0254/07, a/0116/08, and a/0128/08.

2. In the Oral Decision of 25 November 2008, the Presiding Judge directed the VPRS to: *“make it absolutely clear that it relates to a particular category of victims who are to be the subject of general guidance as to whether or not they are going to be allowed to participate.”* He directed the VPRS to file the examples by 4.00pm on 28 November 2008, and that submissions should be filed by the parties and, if relevant, by the participants by 4.00pm on 5 December 2008.²

3. The 19 applications annexed are representative of a category comprising 198 applications to participate in the proceedings in the DRC received by the Registry who allege that they suffered harm as a result of crimes committed by the UPC, including pillage, murder, rape, enslavement or inhuman treatment. The selection has been made as being representative of different types of possible link with the charges, and different types of alleged harm, location and date.
