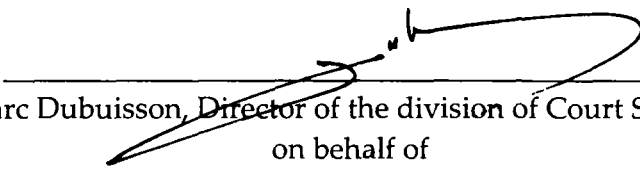
CONSIDERING that in the Decision, the Chamber decided “not to grant leave to the Applicants pursuant to rule 103”;
