I. Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“the Prosecution”) herewith notifies Trial Chamber III (“the Chamber”) of its disclosure, on 18 December 2009, to the Defence team of Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo, of 74 documents amounting to 129 pages of information relating to judicial proceedings from the Central African Republic (“CAR”). The documents are being disclosed pursuant to the Chamber’s order contained in its “Second decision on disclosure relating to an admissibility challenge.”¹

II. Request for Confidentiality

2. Annex A appended to this communication contains the “List of Disclosed Material” provided to the Defence. The material consists of items specifically ordered to be disclosed by the Chamber: decisions, formal notification of decisions and other judicial documents received from the CAR authorities.² The Prosecution requests that this annex be received by the Chamber as Confidential, *Ex Parte* Prosecution and Defence only, as this list contains information of a confidential nature which, although requested by the Defence as potentially bearing on the issue of the admissibility of the case, is not known to the public.
