1. On Friday 26 February 2010 the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (VPRS) of the Registry filed 86 applications to participate in the proceedings to the parties in redacted form for transmission to the parties,¹ in accordance with paragraph 39 iii) of the Decision of the Chamber dated 22 February 2010.² The redactions had been prepared in accordance with paragraph 33 of the Decision.
2. After giving the command to apply the redactions in the electronic system used for redactions, in accordance with its usual practice the VPRS conducted random checking in order to verify that the redactions had in fact been applied. These checks, involving approximately ten of the applications, did not reveal any problems.
3. On Monday 1 March 2010, VPRS was informed by the Court Management Section (CMS) that it had come to their attention that redactions to some of the pages of some of the documents in the annexes had not actually been applied. After consultation with the Chamber, CMS immediately reclassified all the annexes as Confidential, Ex Parte VPRS only.
4. VPRS has requested an urgent investigation by the Information and Communications Technology Section with a view to ascertaining why the relevant systems did not work on this occasion and correcting any technical problems so that this cannot recur.
5. Meanwhile, VPRS has checked all of the applications and ensured that all of the redactions are applied. The 86 applications, in redacted form, are retransmitted as annexes hereto.
