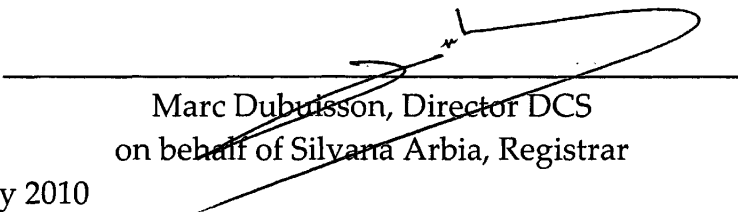
NOTING Article 68(1) of the Statute, Rule 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and Regulation 86(5) of the Regulations of the Court;

CONSIDERING that on 14 June 2010, the Registry transmitted 192 applications for participation¹ in the proceedings in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo* to the Trial Chamber together with a report;²

CONSIDERING that in its Decision of 22 February 2010 the Chamber provided instructions to the Registry on how to prepare redacted versions of applications;³

CONSIDERING that the Chamber instructed the Registry to prepare redacted versions of the 192 applications and to transmit them to the parties;⁴

TRANSMITS the 192 applications to participate in the proceedings to the parties in redacted version.

¹ For applicants a/0014/10, a/0015/10, a/0018/10, a/0020/10, a/0024/10, and a/0025/10, both applications for participation and applications for reparations have been filed, each as a separate annexe, in each case the application for reparations preceding the application for participation. The reason for including the applications for reparations with these particular applications is that in these cases the applications for reparations were completed prior to the applications to participate, the latter often making specific references to the previously-completed reparations applications. Hence, it is only by seeing the two together that the complete information related to the applications for participation can be seen. In accordance with Rule 94(2), the Registry will notify to the Defence all reparations applications upon commencement of the trial.
