THE REGISTRAR of the International Criminal Court,

PURSUANT TO article 43(6) of the Rome Statute;

PURSUANT TO rules 16(1)(b) and (c) and 90(5) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence;

PURSUANT TO regulations 83 to 85 of the Regulations of the Court;

PURSUANT TO regulations 113 and 131 to 136 of the Regulations of the Registry;

NOTING the declarations of indigence signed by Applicants a/0443/09, a/0445/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09 and a/0450/09 and filed on 24 August 2009;

NOTING the decision of Pre-Trial Chamber I dated 10 December 2009¹ granting Applicants a/0443/09, a/0444/09, a/0445/09, a/0446/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09, a/0449/09 and a/0450/09 the status of victims authorised to participate in the proceedings in *The Prosecutor v. Omar Hassan Ahmad Al-Bashir*;

NOTING the applications for legal assistance submitted by Mr Nicholas Kaufman, the Legal Representative of Applicants a/0443/09, a/0444/09, a/0445/09, a/0446/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09, a/0449/09 and a/0450/09 on 18 and 19 December 2009;

ISSUES THE PRESENT DECISION

CONSIDERING that Pre-Trial Chamber I granted victim status to Applicants a/0443/09, a/0444/09, a/0445/09, a/0446/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09, a/0449/09 and a/0450/09 on 10 December 2009;²

CONSIDERING the information provided by Applicants a/0443/09, a/0444/09, a/0445/09, a/0446/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09, a/0449/09 and a/0450/09 concerning their moveable and immoveable assets, their profession and number of dependants;

CONSIDERING that, in order to facilitate the investigation into their indigence, Applicants a/0443/09, a/0445/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09 and a/0450/09 have freely given consent to the Registrar, or her representative, to take all the necessary measures with financial institutions and land registries and, if so required, to access their bank accounts and have undertaken to inform her of any change in their financial situation;

CONSIDERING that Applicants a/0444/09, a/0446/09 and a/0449/09 have not given consent to the Registrar, or her representative, to take all the necessary measures with financial institutions and land registries or, if so required, to access their bank accounts and have not undertaken to inform her of any change in their financial situation;

CONSIDERING that a preliminary examination of the said information, in accordance with the provisions of regulation 84(1) of the Regulations of the Court, suggests, *prima facie*, that Applicants a/0443/09, a/0445/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09 and a/0450/09 do not have sufficient means to assume all or part of the costs of their legal representation before the Court;

FOR THESE REASONS

DECIDES to provisionally consider Applicants a/0443/09, a/0445/09, a/0447/09, a/0448/09 and a/0450/09 wholly indigent under regulation 85(1) *in fine* of the Regulations of the Court, pending the outcome of the investigation into their property and assets;

DECIDES that, in the present circumstances, Applicants a/0444/09, a/0446/09 and a/0449/09 are not considered indigent until such time as they have presented an undertaking to facilitate the investigation into their property and assets;

DECIDES that the scope of the legal assistance which will be granted to the applicants who have been provisionally considered indigent will be determined on a case-by-case basis according to the modalities of their participation, as specified by Pre-Trial Chamber I;

INVITES the applicants who have been provisionally considered indigent to file an application for legal assistance whenever necessary in order to take any action required to protect their interests in the proceedings;

INFORMS the applicants that a decision defining the scope of the legal assistance they will be granted in response to their applications filed on 18 and 19 December 2009 will be issued in the very near future;

INFORMS the applicants concerned by the present decision that they may apply to the Presidency to review it within fifteen days from the date of notification of the decision, in accordance with the provisions of regulation 85(3) of the Regulations of the Court;

NOTIFIES this decision to Mr Nicholas Kaufman, in his capacity as the Legal Representative of the applicants.
