1. On 19 November 2010, Trial Chamber III (“Chamber”) issued its “Decision on the admission into evidence of materials contained in the prosecution’s list of evidence”¹ ordering the Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) to submit an updated list of evidence reflecting the order of witnesses approved by the Chamber,² and to provide information on how it intends to submit documentary and audio-visual evidence contained in its list of evidence at trial.³
2. In compliance with the Chamber’s orders, the Prosecution submits as Annexes A and B⁴ appended to this submission, a revised and updated list of evidence reflecting the order of witnesses approved by the Chamber. The Prosecution proposes to submit documentary and other audio-visual evidence contained in its list of evidence through a bar table motion at appropriate stages in the trial. At the status conference on 21 October 2010, the Chamber delivered an oral ruling accepting the Prosecution’s proposal on time-frames for the submission of bar-table motions.⁵

3. The Prosecution requests that Annexes A and B, be received by the Chamber as “Confidential” as they relate to confidential information that is not known to the public.
