The Registrar of the International Criminal Court (the “Court”);

NOTING the “Order on the transmission of 7 new victims’ applications and the submission of observations” issued by Trial Chamber I (the “Chamber”) on 8 March 2011 ordering the Registry to transmit seven new victim’s applications to participate in the proceedings, suitably redacted under Article 68(1) of the Rome Statute, to the Prosecution and defence for observations by 14 March 2011;¹

NOTING article 68 (1) of the Rome Statute, rule 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court;

CONSIDERING that the Chamber ordered the Registry to consult, before transmission, the legal representatives currently representing the seven victims, Mr Keta Orwinyo and Mr Diakiese, to ensure that the redactions are limited to those strictly necessary for security reasons;²

CONSIDERING that applications a/0335/10, a/1610/10, a/1615/10, a/1616/10, a/1619/10, a/1621/10 and a/1622/10 contain information which may lead to the identification of the applicants and their whereabouts;

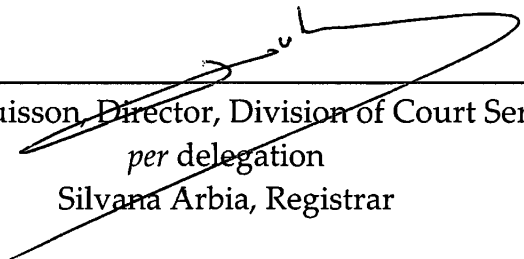
