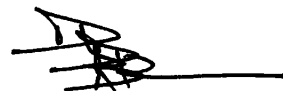

The Appeals Chamber of the International Criminal Court,

In the appeal of the Republic of Kenya against the decision of Pre-Trial Chamber II entitled “Decision on the Request for Assistance Submitted on Behalf of the Government of the Republic of Kenya Pursuant to Article 93(10) of the Statute and Rule 194 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence” of 29 June 2011 (ICC-01/09-63),

Having before it the “Appeal of the Government of Kenya against the ‘Decision on the Request for Assistance Submitted on Behalf of the Government of the Republic of Kenya Pursuant to Article 93(10) of the Statute and Rule 194 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence’” of 4 July 2011 (ICC-01/09-70; hereinafter: “Notice of Appeal”), in which the Republic of Kenya claims, at paragraphs 6 to 10, that the appeal may be brought under article 82 (1) (a) of the Statute,

Considering that before addressing any other issue in the appeal, it is necessary to examine *in limine* whether the appeal is admissible,

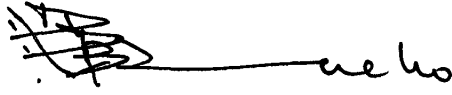
Issues, pursuant to regulation 28 of the Regulations of the Court, the following

DIRECTIONS
