NOTING the Scheduling order issued by Trial Chamber I (the "Chamber") on 14 March 2012, ordering the Registry to transmit to the Chamber by 16.00 on 28 March 2012, the current applications for reparations (the "Order");¹

NOTING article 75 of the Rome Statute, rules 85 and 94 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the "Rules"), regulations 23 *bis*, 24 *bis*(2) and 88 of the Regulations of the Court and regulation 110 of the Regulations of the Registry;

CONSIDERING that the applications for reparations are filed with the status "Confidential, *ex parte* only available to the Registry" in order to sufficiently protect the identity of the applicants, their relatives and/or their intermediaries;

CONSIDERING that the Registry has received to date 85 applications for reparations and has transmitted them to the Defence in compliance with Rule 94(2) of the Rules;²

TRANSMITS to the Chamber the 85 applications for reparations received so far by the Registry, as instructed by the Chamber.
