The Registrar of the International Criminal Court (the “Court”);

NOTING the First Report of the Registry to Trial Chamber I (the “Chamber”) on applications for reparations notified on 28 March 2012;¹

NOTING the Decision of the Chamber notified on 5 April 2012, in which the Chamber decided that the Registry shall appoint the Office of the Public Counsel for Victims (the “OPCV”) as legal representative for all unrepresented applicants and instructed the Registry to provide the OPCV with the applications for reparations of unrepresented applicants received so far as well as any future unrepresented applications;²

NOTING the Disciplinary Board Decision dated 18 June 2012 (the “Board’s Decision”) suspending Me Joseph Keta from his right to practice before the Court for a period of 3 months;³

CONSIDERING that 33 applicants for reparations were represented by Me Joseph Keta who are now unrepresented as a consequence of the Board’s Decision;⁴

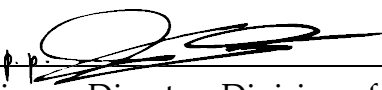
