The Registrar of the International Criminal Court (the “Court”);

NOTING the Decision establishing the principles and procedures to be applied to reparations issued by Trial Chamber I (the “Chamber”) on 7 August 2012, ordering the Registry to transmit to the Trust Fund for Victims the individual application forms for reparations received thus far by the Registry (the “Decision”);¹

NOTING articles 75 and 79 of the Rome Statute, rules 85, 94 and 98 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the “Rules”), regulations 23 *bis*, 24 *bis*(2) and 88 of the Regulations of the Court;

CONSIDERING that the Registry has received to date 86 applications for reparations;

CONSIDERING that the Registry has transmitted 85 applications for reparations in redacted version to the Defence in compliance with Rule 94(2) of the Rules² and in their original version to the Chamber in compliance with the Scheduling Order issued on 14 March 2012;³

CONSIDERING that one additional application for reparations not previously transmitted is filed with the status “Confidential, *ex parte* only available to the Trust Fund for Victims and the Registry” in order to sufficiently protect the identity of the applicant, his/her relatives and/or intermediaries;

GRANTS access to the Trust Fund for Victims to the 85 applications for reparations previously transmitted in their original and redacted versions;

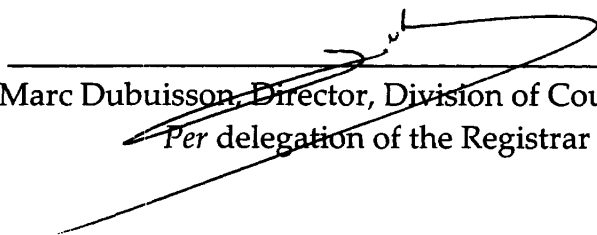

TRANSMITS to the Trust Fund for Victims the original version of one application for reparations not previously transmitted by the Registry;

INFORMS the Chamber that the Registry will actively cooperate with the Trust Fund for Victims, in particular by providing to it any useful information relating to the victims concerned, as instructed by the Chamber.⁴
