Document to be notified in accordance with regulation 31 of the Regulations of the Court to:

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1. In its "Decision on first prosecution application for delayed disclosure of witness identities",¹ Trial Chamber V authorised the Prosecution to temporarily maintain category B.1 redactions to the identifying information in the transcripts and statements of witnesses P-336, P-356, P-397 and P-450 until such time as their identities are disclosed. The Chamber observed however that the dates of interview should not, as a general matter, be redacted as identifying information.
2. In accordance with this decision, on 16 January 2013, the Prosecution lifted redactions to the interview dates in the materials related to these witnesses, and re-disclosed 63 items, as spelled out in the list attached as Confidential Annex A.²
