The Registrar of the International Criminal Court (“the Court”);

NOTING the Single Judge’s decisions on victims’ participation in proceedings related to the situation in Uganda (the “Situation”), notified respectively on 13 August 2007,¹ 21 November 2008,² and 12 March 2012;³

NOTING the Registry’s report on certain documents previously accepted by the Chamber as proof of identity of applicants to participate in the proceedings notified on 23 April 2012 (the “VPRS report of 2012”);⁴

NOTING the Single Judge’s instruction, conveyed by email of 17 January 2013, to file consolidated versions of 12 applications⁵ in relation to which the Registry had received supplementary documentation, together with a report thereon, by 15 February 2013;⁶

NOTING article 68(3) of the Rome Statute, rule 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 23 *bis*, 24 *bis* (2) and 86(5) of the Regulations of the Court;

CONSIDERING that the annexes to the present document are filed with the status “Confidential *ex parte*, only available to the Registry”, in order to sufficiently protect the identity of the applicants and, when applicable, intermediaries;

CONSIDERING that the Registry has received supplementary documentation with regard to 12 applications which have been deferred by the Chamber;⁷

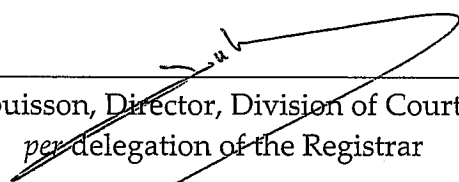

CONSIDERING that among the supplementary documents received are identity documents that some applicants have been able to provide to supplement the identity documents they had initially submitted along with their applications for participation;⁸ but that in other instances the Local Council letter (the "L.C. letter") remains the only form of document that applicants are able to provide as proof of identity and/or proof of kinship;⁹

CONSIDERING that of the 12 applications, 3 - a/0079/07, a/0088/07 and a/0104/07 - appear to fall within the scope of the case *The Prosecutor against Joseph Kony Vincent Otti, Okot Odhiambo and Dominic Ongwen*, and 9 - a/0087/06, a/0014/07, a/0209/07, a/0217/07, a/0220/07, a/0221/07, a/0229/07 a/0235/07 and a/0324/07 - appear to be related only to the Situation;

TRANSMITS to the Chamber the consolidated versions of applications a/0087/06, a/0014/07, a/0209/07, a/0217/07, a/0220/07, a/0221/07 a/0229/07, a/0235/07 and a/0324/07 (the "Applications") which appear to be linked only to the Situation, together with a report thereon;¹⁰

INFORMS the Chamber that the Registry is in a position to immediately transmit the Applications in a redacted form to the parties, if so instructed by the Chamber.
