NOTING Trial Chamber V’s (the “Chamber”) Decision on victims’ representation and participation notified on 3 October 2012 (the “3 October Decision”), directing the Victims Participation and Reparation Section (the “VPRS”) to file every two months, in cooperation with the Common Legal Representative (the “CLR”), a comprehensive report on the general situation of victims as a whole, including statistics about the victims’ population and information in relation to registered and non-registered victims;¹

NOTING articles 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute and rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence;

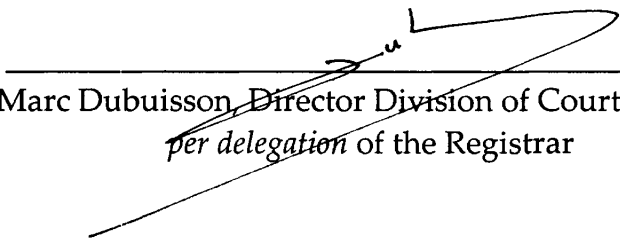
CONSIDERING that neither the CLR nor the VPRS have conducted significant field related activities in Kenya during the reporting period due to events surrounding the presidential elections held on 4 March 2013;

CONSIDERING that the VPRS and the CLR have used the relative lull in field related activities to continue to work on the implementation of the registration system envisaged by the Chamber in the 3 October Decision;²

INFORMS the Chamber that the VPRS is currently not in a position to file detailed statistics and a comprehensive report on the victims met in this Case during the reporting period due to the relative lull in field related activities during the current reporting period. However, the VPRS anticipates that field related activities will be carried out during the subsequent reporting period and that detailed statistics and a comprehensive report will be presented to the Chamber in the next two-month report.
