Prosecution's Report

1. In the "Decision Regarding the Non-Disclosure of 116 Documents Collected Pursuant to Article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute",¹ the Single Judge ordered the Prosecution to submit a report every two weeks on the status of the documents obtained under article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute ("Statute") that are to be disclosed to the Defence.
2. On 3 February, 18 February and 5 March 2014, the Prosecution filed its first, second and third reports as ordered.²
3. On 10 March 2014, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence nine documents from one provider. Lifting of restrictions for those documents was reported in the Prosecution's third report.³ The Prosecution is pursuing on-going consultations with the providers to obtain lifting of restrictions imposed on the remaining documents.
4. The status of disclosure remains unchanged from the Prosecution's third report. To date, the Prosecution has obtained lifting of restrictions for the following documents: (a) 45 documents out of the 172 identified as containing information falling within the provisions of rule 77, and (b) 12 documents classified as incriminating.
