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Prosecution's Report

1. In the "Decision Regarding the Non-Disclosure of 116 Documents Collected Pursuant to Article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute",¹ the Single Judge ordered the Prosecution to submit a report every two weeks on the status of the documents obtained under article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute ("Statute") that are to be disclosed to the Defence.
2. On 3 February, 18 February, 5 March, 20 March and 4 April 2014, the Prosecution filed its first, second, third, fourth and fifth reports as ordered.²
3. On 7 April 2014, one provider lifted restrictions to 184 documents. 58 documents were listed as part of the 116 documents submitted to the Single Judge on 17 January 2014.³ 38 documents were listed as part of the 56 documents submitted to the Single Judge on 30 January 2014.⁴ 88 documents were classified as incriminating. All 184 documents were disclosed to the Defence on 16 April 2014.

4. To date, the Prosecution has obtained lifting of restrictions for the following documents: (a) 141 documents out of the 172 identified as containing information falling within the provisions of rule 77, and (b) 100 documents classified as incriminating.
