Introduction

1. The Prosecution herewith submits its communication of the disclosure of incriminatory evidence pursuant to Articles 64(3)(c) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute.

Procedural background

2. On 4 July 2014 and 8 July 2014 respectively, the Prosecution filed its eleventh and twelfth applications for redactions to documents to be disclosed as incriminatory evidence.¹
3. On 17 July 2014, the Single Judge issued her “Decision on the Prosecutor's Eleventh and Twelfth Applications for Redactions”, authorising redactions to these materials and ordering the Prosecution to disclose them to the Defence within five days of the notification of her decision.²

Disclosure of evidence

4. On 22 July 2014, in accordance with the Single Judge’s decision, the Prosecution disclosed part of these redacted materials to the Defence, including one witness statement and 13 transcripts of the interview of a second witness. For technical reasons, the implementation of redactions to the audio recordings of that same interview could only be completed on 23 July 2014 and, therefore, the redacted audio recordings were disclosed separately on 24 July 2014.

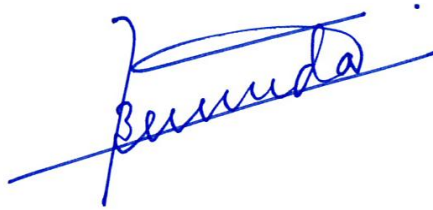
