Introduction

1. The Prosecution provides notice of the disclosure of incriminatory evidence pursuant to Articles 64(3)(c) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute.

Disclosure of evidence

2. On 31 July 2014, the Prosecution re-disclosed as incriminating evidence 198 items previously disclosed under the provisions of Rule 77 or Article 67(2) as well as seven items not previously disclosed.¹
3. The Prosecution appends the total list of the evidence disclosed in Confidential Annex A.

4. Pursuant to Regulation 23bis(1), the annex to this document is classified as confidential because it references disclosed materials designated as such.
