The Registrar of the International Criminal Court (the “Court”);

NOTING the Order notified on 27 August 2014 issued by Trial Chamber II (the “Chamber”) whereby the Registry was instructed to report on applications for reparations by 1 December 2014 (the “Order of 27 August 2014”);¹

NOTING the Order notified on 24 November 2014 issued by the Chamber whereby the Chamber grants the Registry’s request for extension of time limit to 15 December 2014;²

NOTING articles 68 (1) and 75 of the Rome Statute, rules 94 and 97 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, regulation 88 of the Regulations of the Court (the Regulations”) and regulation 110 of the Regulations of the Registry;

CONSIDERING that the mission organized jointly with the Legal Representative of victims to interview victims and applicants on reparations, in accordance with the Chamber’s Order of 27 August 2014, started on 25 September 2014 and ended on 17 November 2014;

CONSIDERING that during this mission the Registry managed to individually interview 305 of the 365³ victims who had submitted applications, in order to receive additional and up-to-date information on the harm suffered as a result of the crimes and the reparations measures sought by the victims;

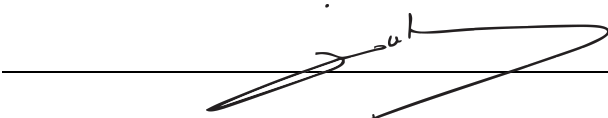
³ This number comprises 353 victims authorised to participate in the proceedings and in relation to whom the crimes suffered were recognized as committed by the accused in the final Judgement (some of whom have also submitted applications for reparations), and 14 applicants for reparations not participating as victims in the proceedings. One duplicate was identified during the mission (a/0208/09 is a duplicate of a/0210/08) and one victim requested to withdraw from the proceedings (a/0317/09, see the further notification submitted by the LRV: ICC-01/04-01/07-3509).

CONSIDERING that the Registry also made preliminary inquiries and met with certain interlocutors on the ground with a view to including recommendations regarding the types and modalities of reparations and factors relating to the appropriateness of awarding reparations on an individual or collective basis, as well as any measures already taken to redress the harm caused by the attack on Bogoro of 24 February 2003;

CONSIDERING that the annexes to the present submission are filed with the status “Confidential *ex parte* only available to the Registry, the Legal Representative of Victims and the Trust Fund for Victims” as they contain information which may lead to the identification of victims/applicants and their whereabouts or could serve to identify other persons who have communicated with the Court and who may thereby be put at risk;

TRANSMITS to the Chamber the Registry’s report on applications for reparations as Annexes 1 to 3 to the present submission.

INFORMS the Chamber that the Registry stands ready to file a public redacted version of the report if ordered by the Chamber.
