Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) provides notice of the disclosure of incriminating evidence pursuant to articles 64(3)(c) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute.

Disclosure of evidence

2. On 21 January 2015 and 30 January 2015 respectively, the Prosecution disclosed 322 and 3695 items as incriminating evidence. The Prosecution notes that 1196 items of the latter 3695 items had already been disclosed in this case. The Prosecution re-disclosed these items either because it has re-classified them as incriminatory evidence or because it has lifted or converted certain redactions to the approved redaction category codes, in accordance with the Redaction Protocol.¹ Additionally, the Prosecution re-issued certain metadata fields for 44 items with previously applied redactions lifted or converted to the approved redaction category codes.
3. The Prosecution appends the list of the evidence disclosed in Confidential, Prosecution and Defence Only Annex A.
