DECISION DESIGNATING A SINGLE JUDGE ON VICTIMS' ISSUES

PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER II of the International Criminal Court (the “Court”);

NOTING article 39, paragraph 2b(iii), of the Statute of the Court (the “Statute”), pursuant to which the functions of the Pre-Trial Chamber shall be carried out either by three judges of the Pre-Trial Division or by a single judge of that division in accordance with the Statute and the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the “Rules”);

NOTING article 57, paragraph 2b, of the Statute, providing that a single judge of the Pre-Trial Chamber may exercise the functions provided for in the Statute other than those listed under article 57, paragraph 2(a), unless otherwise provided for in the Rules or by a majority of the Pre-Trial Chamber;

NOTING rule 7, sub-rule 1 of the Rules, pursuant to which the Pre-Trial Chamber shall designate a single judge on the basis of objective pre-established criteria;

NOTING regulation 47, sub-regulation 1, of the Regulations of the Court (the “Regulations”), providing that the designation of a single judge shall be based upon criteria agreed upon by the Pre-Trial Chamber, including considerations of the issues involved, the circumstances of the proceedings before the Chamber, the distribution of work within the Chamber and the proper management and efficiency in the handling of cases;

NOTING that a number of applications for participation in the proceedings have been filed by victims in respect of the situation in Uganda and of the case against Joseph Kony, Vincent Otti, Raska Lukwiya, Okot Odhiambo and Dominic Ongwen;

CONSIDERING that, in the light of the number, the nature and the specificity of the issues arising in connection with victims' applications for participation, at this stage of the proceedings the designation of a single judge responsible for all such issues appears necessary and appropriate with a view to their prompt and efficient handling;

CONSIDERING that the Chamber previously designated a single judge as responsible for issues relating to the unsealing of documents in the situation in Uganda and in the case against Joseph Kony, Vincent Otti, Raska Lukwiya, Okot Odhiambo and Dominic Ongwen¹, on the basis of the need to preserve and ensure the efficient handling of such issues;

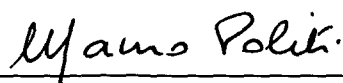
NOTING regulation 47, sub-regulation 2 of the Regulations, providing that the Pre-Trial Chamber may designate more than one single judge when the efficient management of the workload of the Chamber so requires;

**HAVING REGARD THERETO AND FOR THESE REASONS, THE CHAMBER
HEREBY**

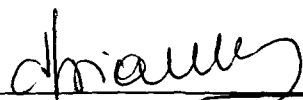

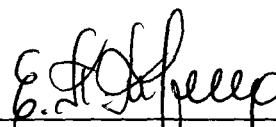
