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Prosecution's Submission

1. On 16 February 2015, the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") requested Trial Chamber VI ("Chamber") to authorise "non-standard redactions"¹ in relation to a number of individuals and witnesses, including P-0882.²
2. The Prosecution requested authorisation to submit proposed redactions to the transcriptions of P-0882's interview, conducted pursuant to article 55(2) of the Rome Statute, by 2 March 2015.³ This was due to the fact that the transcriptions of this interview had not been finalised by the 16 February 2015 deadline for applications for non-standard redactions set by the Chamber.⁴
3. The Prosecution sets out the requested non-standard redactions to the transcriptions of P-0882's interview at Confidential, *EX PARTE*, Annex A to this filing.⁵ These redactions are necessary for the reasons set out in the Prosecution request for redactions.⁶

Confidentiality

4. The annex to this filing is classified as "Confidential, *EX PARTE*- only available to the Prosecution, and VWU" pursuant to regulation 23bis(1) of the Regulations of the Court because it contains information relevant to the identity and security situation of an individual in relation to whom redactions are being sought.
