**NOTING** Trial Chamber VI’s (the “Chamber”) Decision on victims’ participation in trial proceedings notified on 6 February 2015 (the “Participation Decision”);<sup>1</sup>

**NOTING** article 68 (1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 89(1) and 91(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 23 *bis* and 86(8) of the Regulations of the Court;

**CONSIDERING** that the annexes to the present document are notified with the status “Confidential, available only to the Prosecution and the Defence” in accordance with the instructions provided by the Chamber at paragraph 24(iv) of the Participation Decision;

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber in paragraph 24(ii) of the Participation Decision ordered the Registry to assess the applications into three groups<sup>2</sup> on the basis of guidance provided by the Chamber in Section III(B) of the Participation Decision;

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber in paragraph 24(iv) of the Participation Decision ordered the Registry to transmit all simplified application forms it has assessed as falling under Group C, with any necessary redactions, to the parties;<sup>3</sup>

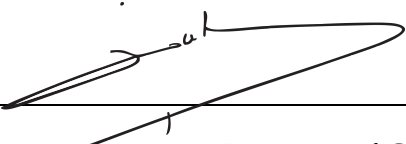
