NOTING the “*Decision on Prosecution requests to join the cases of The Prosecutor v. Laurent Gbagbo and The Prosecutor v. Charles Blé Goudé and related matters*”, rendered by Trial Chamber I (hereinafter the “Chamber”) on 11 March 2015;¹

NOTING the “*Decision on requests for clarification concerning review of the case record and extension of time*”, rendered by the Chamber on 13 April 2015;²

CONSIDERING that in its Decision of 11 March 2015, the Chamber ordered *inter alia* the Registry to indicate “any objection, and the reasons therefore, to any party or participant being granted access to any confidential document or material on either the Blé Goudé or Gbagbo case records”;³

CONSIDERING that in its Decision of 13 April 2015, the Chamber extended the deadline for the above-mentioned objections, if any, to 28 April 2015;⁴

NOTING articles 43(6), 64(3) and 68(1) and (4) of the Rome Statute (the “Statute”), rules 16 to 19, 85, 88, 89 and 132(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the “Rules”), regulations 54 and 86 of the Regulations of the Court (the “Regulations”) and regulations 79 to 96 of the Regulations of the Registry;

RESPECTFULLY SUBMITS AS FOLLOWS:

1. With regards to the documents previously submitted by the Registry on all aspects of the detention of Mr Gbagbo and Mr Blé Goudé, victims and witness related aspects as such, aspects of victims participation and reparations, legal

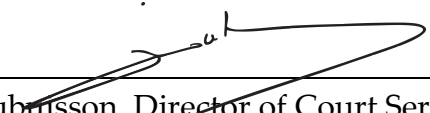

representation, State cooperation (in relation to Arrest, Surrender and transfer or progress reports thereon) as well as Registry transmission filings following documents received during hearings, the Registry indicates that there is no objection to any party or participant being granted access to any confidential document or material on either the Blé Goudé or Gbagbo case records on the condition that the same level of classification is maintained, except for the documents mentioned in annex A to this present document.

2. In annex A, specific reasoning as to the Registry's request to maintain the restricted level of access is provided.

3. Annex A has been submitted as confidential *ex parte* Registry only as providing access to the parties and participants considering it contains information which is not to be shared beyond the Registry.
