The Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") herewith notifies Pre-Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") of its disclosure, on 15 May 2012, to the Defence team of Laurent Gbagbo, of 42 incriminating documents.¹

Pursuant to Pre-Trial III's order of 24 January 2012,² the Prosecution provided the Defence with Pre-Confirmation INCRIM Package 10, which contains the documents collected after 24 January 2012 for which no protective measures are required, on which the Prosecution intends to rely at the confirmation hearing. This package also contained two documents related to Witness P-0054 with redactions authorised by the Chamber on 27 March 2012.³
