Trial Chamber VII ('Chamber') of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo, Aimé Kilolo Musamba, Jean-Jacques Mangenda Kabongo, Fidèle Babala Wandu and Narcisse Arido*, having regard to Article 64(10) of the Rome Statute, issues the following 'Decision on the requests of the Defence for Mr Kilolo and Mr Bemba related to the monitoring of communications'.

1. On 13 April 2015, the defence for Mr Bemba and the defence for Mr Kilolo (together, the 'Defence'), submitted their respective observations in preparation for the first status conference convened on 24 April 2015.¹
2. In their observations, the Defence requested the Chamber to order the Office of the Prosecutor ('Prosecution') to confirm whether the accused and their counsel were under electronic surveillance by the Prosecution, or at the instance of the Prosecution ('Request').²
3. At the status conference on 24 April 2015, the Chamber directed the Prosecution to respond to the Request in writing by 1 May 2015.³
4. Accordingly, the Prosecution filed its response on the aforementioned date, confirming that, other than what was already known to the parties, Mr Bemba, Mr Kilolo and their respective counsel were not under electronic surveillance. It therefore submitted that the Chamber should dismiss the Request as moot.⁴

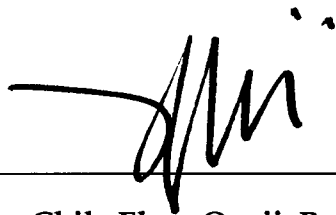

5. The Chamber considers that, given the information from the Prosecution, the Request is moot.⁵

DISMISSES the Request as moot.
