Prosecution's Report

1. In the "Decision Setting the Regime for Evidence Disclosure and Other Related Matters" ("Decision"),¹ the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") was ordered to submit a monthly progress report on the status of documents affected by article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute. During a status conference on 19 May 2015, the Single Judge amended its Decision. The Single Judge ordered that rather than submit monthly reports, the Prosecutor "inform the Chamber on any relevant development as soon as there are any developments".²

2. In compliance with the Single Judge's 19 May 2015 Order, the Prosecution informs the Chamber that on 28 May 2015, an information provider, responsible for 91 documents totalling 91 pages, provided written consent to lift article 54(3)(e) restrictions.

3. This development means that to date, article 54(3)(e) restrictions have been lifted on 5,990 documents, amounting to 46,267 pages. Material affected by article 54(3)(e) restrictions has now been reduced to 229 documents, amounting to 706 pages. The Prosecution continues to seek to locate and consult with information providers with respect to the outstanding material subject to article 54(3)(e) restrictions.
