NOTING Trial Chamber VI’s (the “Chamber”) Decision on Victims’ Participation in Trial Proceedings notified on 6 February 2015;¹

NOTING the Chamber’s Second Decision on Victims’ Participation in Trial Proceedings notified on 16 June 2015 (the “Second Victim Participation Decision”) that granted participation status to 929 victims of attacks carried out by the UPC/FPLC (“victims of the attacks”) and 141 child soldiers;²

NOTING that the Chamber in the Second Victim Participation Decision also decided, by majority, that the legal representation system organised at the confirmation stage of proceedings should be maintained during trial proceedings;³

NOTING the Chamber’s Third Decision on Victims’ Participation in Trial Proceedings notified on 2 July 2015 that granted participation status to 923 victims of the attacks and 156 child soldiers;⁴

NOTING article 68(3) of the Rome Statute, rule 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 24 *bis* and 86(8) of the Regulations of the Court;

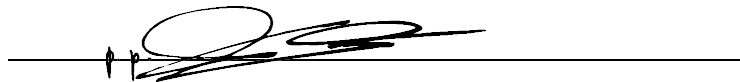
