NOTING Trial Chamber VI’s (the “Chamber”) First Decision on Victims’ Participation in Trial Proceedings notified on 6 February 2015 (the “First Victim Participation Decision”)¹ and its Second² and Third³ Decisions notified on 16 June 2015 and 2 July 2015 respectively;

NOTING the Chamber’s oral ruling issued on 3 July 2015 during a status conference, setting a new trial commencement date of 2 September 2015;⁴

NOTING article 68 (1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 89(1) and 91(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 23 *bis* and 86(8) of the Regulations of the Court;

CONSIDERING that, pursuant to regulation 23*bis* (1) of the Regulations of the Court, the annexes to the present document are notified with the status “Confidential *Ex Parte*, available only to the Registry” as these contain information identifying the applicants;

CONSIDERING that the Chamber in paragraph 24(i) of the First Victim Participation Decision ordered the Registry to transmit all complete applications in its possession to the Chamber, on a rolling basis;

CONSIDERING that the Chamber in paragraph 24(ii) of the First Victim Participation Decision ordered the Registry to assess the applications into three
