NOTING Trial Chamber V's Decision on victims' representation and participation notified on 3 October 2012, directing the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (the "VPRS") to file every two months, in cooperation with the Common Legal Representative (the "CLR"), a comprehensive report on the general situation of victims as a whole, including statistics about the victims' population and information in relation to registered and non-registered victims (the "3 October 2012 Decision");¹

NOTING Trial Chamber V(A)'s (the "Chamber") Decision notified on 14 November 2013, directing the Registry to include additional specific information in its two month reports (the "Decision of 14 November 2013");²

NOTING article 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court;

CONSIDERING that during the reporting period (24 September – 23 November 2015) the CLR reported that he did not conduct any meetings with victims in the field, but that he engaged in telephone communications with up to 110 victims during the reporting period in order to obtain their views and concerns on matters related to the proceedings;³

CONSIDERING that the information presented in annexes A⁴ and B⁵ of the Registry's Seventeenth Periodic Report pertaining to the activities of the Registry remains unchanged;

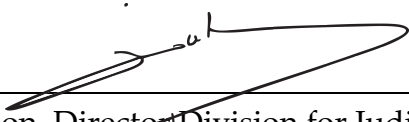
