1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) submits a second amended version of its List of Evidence. Confidential Annex A is a clean copy of the amended List of Evidence. Confidential Annex B is a marked-up version of the amended List of Evidence, with all additions designated. Confidential Annex C is a list of all additions to the List of Evidence.

Procedural History

2. On 30 June 2015, the Prosecution submitted its List of Evidence.¹
3. On 26 October 2015, the Prosecution submitted its first amended List of Evidence,² including a clean version³ and a version with amendments highlighted.⁴ It did so as authorised by the Chamber’s Second Decision on Prosecution’s requests for variation of the time limit for disclosure of certain documents and to add some to its List of Evidence.⁵
4. On 30 November 2015, the Chamber issued its Third decision on disclosure related matters and amendments to the Prosecution’s List of Evidence.⁶ This decision granted the Prosecution’s requests of 1 October 2015 and 23 October 2015 for variation of the time limit to disclose various materials and to add some of the materials to its List of Evidence. The Chamber also ordered the Prosecution to file an amended version of its List of Evidence, with new items clearly designated.⁷
