Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution"), in accordance with rule 121(2)(c) of the *Rules of Procedure and Evidence* ("the Rules"), provides notice of the disclosure of incriminatory evidence pursuant to articles 61(3)(b) and 64(3)(c) of the *Rome Statute* ("the Statute") and rule 76(1) of the Rules, as well as material that falls under rule 77 of the Rules.

Submission

2. On 16 May 2016, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence two packages of evidence: INCRIM package 20 consisting of 197 items and Rule 77 package 14 consisting 241 items.
3. With respect to the applied redactions, the Prosecution submits that they fall under the "standard categories" that have been pre-approved by the Single Judge of the Pre Trial Chamber II.¹ In addition, as per the Single Judge of this Chamber, the Prosecution notes that the "pre-approved redactions" at the confirmation stage remain in place.² These redactions are minimal and affect neither the substance of the material nor the ability of the Defence to comprehend it.
