Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) provides notice of the disclosure of evidence pursuant to articles 64(3)(c), 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute and rules 76(1) and 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

Submission

2. On 25 July 2016, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence two packages of evidence: Pre-Trial INCR package 25 consisting of 40 items and Pre-Trial rule 77 package 18 consisting of 215 items.
3. With respect to the applied redactions, the Prosecution submits that they fall under the “standard categories” that have been pre-approved by the Single Judge of the Pre Trial Chamber II.¹ In addition, as per the Single Judge of this Chamber, the Prosecution notes that the procedures adopted for “pre-approved redactions” at the confirmation stage remain in place.² These redactions are minimal and affect neither the substance of the material nor the ability of the Defence to comprehend it.
