I. Introduction

1. On 11 November 2010, Pre-Trial Chamber II ordered the Victims Participation and Reparations Section of the Registry (“VPRS”) to report every three months on the applications received in the Situation in the Central African Republic (“Situation in the CAR”) and the progress made by the VPRS on their assessment under rule 85 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.¹
2. The Registry hereby submits its twenty-third periodic report in the Situation in the CAR covering the period from 11 May 2016 to 10 August 2016.

II. Applicable Law

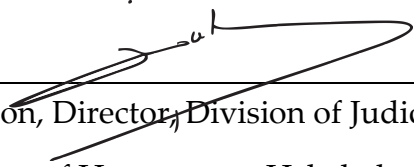
3. The Registry submits the present report in accordance with article 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 16(1) and 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court.

III. Submissions

4. Although the security situation remains volatile in the field, during the reporting period the Registry has maintained communication with intermediaries and victims.
5. The Registry notes that there have been no new developments on the status of participation applications received since the Registry’s fifteenth periodic report on applications received in the Situation in the CAR (“Fifteenth
