1. Jean-Jacques Mangenda hereby submits a personal attestation concerning the absence of any criminal proceedings against him apart from the present case.
2. The Defence had hoped, as indicated in its Request for the Admission of Evidence for the Purposes of Sentencing,¹ to be able to obtain official documentation that was believed to be in the possession of the ICC Registry affirming the non-existence of any such proceedings. The Defence is now informed, however, that the documentation in question cannot be located.
3. The Trial Chamber is accordingly requested to receive Annex A as evidence for the purposes of sentencing. The attestation, given its limited subject matter, is sufficiently reliable in relation to its purpose at this stage of proceedings. The Defence also requests, pursuant to Regulation 35 and its previous request,² that the deadline for receipt of the attached document likewise be extended to permit its admission.
