Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) provides notice of the disclosure of incriminating evidence pursuant to articles 64(3)(c) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute (“Statute”) and material falling within the scope of rule 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (“Rules”).

Disclosure of evidence

2. On 2 February 2017, the Prosecution disclosed a total of fourteen items, including nine items as incriminating evidence and five items under the provision of rule 77.
3. The Prosecution re-discloses as incriminating evidence nine items that had previously been disclosed under a different classification, namely eight MONUC reports and one investigation report. These documents will be added to the Prosecution’s list of evidence.
4. The Prosecution disclosed, under rule 77: (1) the statement of Witness P-0075; (2) two investigation reports related to Witness P-0067; (3) the witness preparation session log and disclosure note of Witness P-0043; (4) and an investigation note related to Witness P-0093.
5. Consistent with its standard practice, the Prosecution transmitted these items to the Registry for uploading into e-Court, which gives the Chamber, Parties and participants access to the materials.
6. The Prosecution appends the list of the evidence disclosed in Confidential Annex A.

7. Pursuant to regulation 23*bis* (2) of the Regulations of the Court, the annex to this document is classified as confidential because it references material that was disclosed confidentially.
